Deliburnsky concludes juvenile campaign with Dave's Friend Stakes score

Happy Tenth Stable's Deliburnsky scored his third career victory in winning the \$75,000 Dave's Friend Stakes for 2-year-olds at Laurel Park on Nov. 26.

Deliburnsky bobbed at the break, but quickly recovered and grabbed command. The New Jersey-bred showed his natural speed and never relinquished the lead, winning by 2¼ lengths in 1:10.81.

Pedro Cotto Jr. rode the son of Flatter for trainer Tony Wilson. The gelding won for the

second consecutive time in stakes company, having come into the race off an easy victory in the Jersey Juvenile for state-breds at Monmouth Park.

"He was a little bit anxious in the gate," said Cotto. "He wanted to go out so fast he stumbled but he picked it up pretty good. I was pretty confident. I knew when I asked him he was going to respond."

Wilson was happy with the way his horse responded.

"We knew it was time to give him an opportunity in another

open stakes race," said Wilson of his charge, who finished off the board in the Sapling Stakes-G3 at Monmouth. "He's a big horse, that's why he stumbled leaving there a little bit. He's got to get a little more ground under him. We're going to go places with this guy."

Bred by Drazin-Aaron-Zaro Stables LLC, Deliburnsky is out of the winning New Jersey-bred mare Deliciously (by Distinctive Pro).

Bombast's shot at Claiming Crown

John Cammeyer and Dermot Murphy's Bombast continued his successful season when he finished second in the \$50,000 Claiming Crown Express Stakes on Dec. 3 at Fair Grounds Race Course in New Orleans, La.

Bombast started the year with five consecutive victories, including three after being claimed from Hope Jones for \$12,500 at Monmouth Park on June 3. Trainer Jane Cibelli was aggressive with the new

addition to her stable and won two races restricted to New Jersey-breds before winning a first-level allowance race in open company. Now 5, the son of Lion Hearted and the Sham mare Duplicity earned \$153,000 in 2011 including \$118,560 after being claimed.

Bred by Hope Haskell Jones, Bombast has a career record of six wins in 18 starts with earnings of \$197,815.

Equine Science Center recognizes Durkin for “Spirit of the Horse”

The Equine Science Center at Rutgers, The State University of New Jersey, has named leading New Jersey attorney Liz Durkin as the 2012 recipient of the “Spirit of the Horse” award. Durkin received the award during the Equine Science Center Update on Dec. 8. Sandy Denarski, chair of the Rutgers University Board for Equine Advancement, and Equine Science Center director Karyn Malinowski presented the award.

The award recognizes individuals whose lives have been profoundly changed because of their involvement with horses and who have acknowledged the impact by giving back to the horse industry.

“Liz Durkin’s passion for horses is palpable, as is her commitment to philanthropy,” said Malinowski. “With her profound love of horses, Ms. Durkin wholeheartedly embraces the Equine Science Center’s mission of better horse care through research and education.”

Horses did not change Durkin’s life right away, but they did so quickly, deeply and forever. The lifelong animal lover was already a graduate of Seton Hall Law School when she took her first riding lesson in 1987. By 1994, she had been victorious at the National Horse Show, just one highlight of more than 20 years as a rider and as an owner on the A circuit.

Over more than two decades, horses have come to shape Durkin’s life personally, professionally and morally. A transactional attorney of 25 years’ standing, she has carved a significant role in the area of equine law, helping horse owners to navigate issues

from business deals to estate planning to buying, selling and breeding. For Durkin, however, the most important contract is always the one with the horse.

“We ask them to do things for our benefit,” she explained. “They compete, they hunt, they hunter pace, they provide pleasure rides. Our end of that partnership is that we are in turn their stewards. It is our responsibility to take care of them.”

As the owner of a 140-acre preserved horse farm in Warren County, Durkin serves as the steward of nine horses, as well as two ponies rescued from kill pens. Six dogs and a cat mostly live at home in Essex County. Besides purchasing six horses from the Young Horse Teaching and Research Program auction, she has sponsored R.U. Levi, a mustang adopted through the program led by Dr. Sarah Ralston. Perhaps one should make that “Professor R.U. Levi”: thanks to Ralston’s advocacy and Durkin’s generosity, the yearling mustang was saved from a Bureau of Land Management round-up, and now serves as a teaching horse for veterinary students learning about neurological difficulties at the University of Pennsylvania’s New Bolton Center. Durkin serves on the board of the Equine Science Center and on the Animal Law Committee of the New Jersey State Bar Association.

As passionate as she is about horses, Durkin has also built a long and strong history as a humanitarian. A member of the Development Council of the Archdiocese of Newark, she supports many charitable causes, with a particular emphasis on educating and empowering women and children in poverty.

Agriculture department honors Hermosillo

Hermosillo, winner of Monmouth Park’s Charles Hesse III Handicap in September, one of five scores for the year, was named New Jersey-bred Thoroughbred of the Year by the state’s Department of Agriculture.

Kenwood Racing LLC’s Hermosillo, a winner of five of his 14 starts last year at age 7, has been named the New Jersey Department of Agriculture’s New Jersey-bred Thoroughbred of the Year for 2011.

Hermosillo won consecutive races at Aqueduct in February and March. Early in the Monmouth Park meet, he finished third in the Bernie Dowd Handicap in June.

The Stephen DiMauro trainee saved his best performances for later in the year as he went on a three-race winning streak at Monmouth during September and October. Hermosillo started the streak by winning the \$100,000 Charles Hesse III Handicap for the second time in three years – defeating the best New Jersey-breds in training. Hermosillo turned in another impressive victory for his second win, going wire to wire and defeating eventual Breeders’ Cup Marathon winner Afleet Again. The son of Sea of Secrets capped off the streak on Oct. 30 in a 1-mile optional claiming race over another stellar field.

Bred by Ed Broome, Hermosillo finished the year with \$235,350 in earnings to bring his career total to \$625,351.
